"A View"

The **truth** as we know it usually comes from where we sit. Hence, a limited perspective is all we have.

The recent troubles at Iowa State, Georgia, and St. Bonaventure only highlight the need for honest talk.

Obviously we have limited space and time to cover such a broad topic. Moreover, none of us has **all** the facts. However, we can safely advance several points in relation to **leadership**.

Each institution has a President. We work our way down from there. The primary issue in all of this controversy remains: ethics, values, and individual virtue. A lack of individual accountability and leadership has always existed in this area, whether it is basketball or life. In other words, scandals are timeless and will continue to be. Why? Because human beings are involved and the quickest way to the top is by taking short cuts. Yet those very same routes are riddled with known pitfalls. In most cases, time will catch the guilty.

The difficult part when Michigan cheats is that history does not right itself completely. Specifically, we lost to "those guys" when I was an assistant coach

at Iowa. The loss felt bad and time moves on- period.

Attending the Final Four is always a treat. I try to find the pulse of conversation. The talk was fairly negative relative to cheating. I know this about that topic; figure out how to win regardless of who you play as excuses come in many different forms. There never was a day or way to beat someone by **crying** about things you cannot control.

The game will outlast **all** of us- good and bad. It is not going anywhere. If you look at all the coaches as a pyramid then the base remains solid as the good guys far outweigh the dirty ones. The silent majority are just that. They go about their daily business with great acumen, pride, and fundamental moral convictions.

Again, what perch do you see from? My attitude stems from reading about the history of the game, talking to all levels of coaches, and evaluating the "whole" from other eclectic sources. Coaching academies, individual clinics, recruiting the globe, magazines, television and the internet are valuable reference points too.

The suggestion that all is well from a moral perspective would be wrong. The game has ethical conflicts because of our leadership. Yet, the view from here remains fairly positive. Sleep tight.
